Articulation Agreement between Oakland Community College and Spring Arbor University

ARTICLE I AGREEMENT ON PRINCIPLE

Oakland Community College (OCC) and Spring Arbor University (SAU) agree that students who choose to begin their studies at OCC and transfer to SAU to earn a bachelor's degree in one of the academic programs listed above should be provided with a smooth curriculum transition that minimizes loss of credit and duplication of coursework. Therefore, OCC and SAU agree to enter into this Articulation Agreement (Agreement) as cooperating educational institutions and will maintain the integrity of their separate programs.

ARTICLE II TRANSFER AGREEMENT

OCC and SAU agree that any student who has successfully completed an associate's degree at OCC may transfer up to 84 semester credit hours to apply toward an accelerated bachelor's degree program at SAU. The SAU Office of Registration and Records will determine which credit hours will be transferred and how they will apply to the desired program of study.

The following stipulations apply:

- 1. Applicants must meet all admissions requirements and be accepted and admitted to SAU.
- 2. Only courses graded a "C" (2.0) or better will transfer to SAU.
- In order for students to receive the benefits of the Michigan Transfer Agreement (MTA), these requirements must be met before enrolling in a bachelor's program at SAU. Applicants who enrolled in college prior to fall 2014 may use the MACRAO agreement and have until August of 2019 to have MACRAO requirements evaluated by the community college. If already on the transcript, the MACRAO designation will be accepted at SAU. Applicants who have not satisfied the MTA or MACRAO agreement must complete SAU's General Education Requirements as applied to transfer students.

- 4. All other SAU graduation and program requirements listed in the effective catalog of matriculation to the program of study must be satisfied, whether by transferred courses, SAU courses, or approved substitutions or waiver. These requirements include total degree credit hour requirements, upper level course credit hour requirements, program course requirements, etc. See effective catalog for details.
- 5. Under this Agreement, graduates of OCC will receive equal consideration with other students seeking admission to the agreed upon program. When program growth results in space limitations, reasonable provisions will be made to reserve space for OCC students planning entry into this program.

ARTICLE III-A RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE SENDING INSTITUTION TO POTENTIAL APPLICANTS

- OCC will be responsible to appropriately and accurately advise students enrolled at OCC into courses that will transfer to the SAU bachelor's program according to the articulation guides (see Appendices).
- 2. OCC will monitor the academic performance of students who intend to enroll at SAU under this Agreement and identify problems that may interfere with the successful transfer of students to SAU and assist student to correct them.

ARTICLE III-B RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE RECEIVING INSTITUTION TO STUDENTS

1. SAU will be responsible for advising students admitted to an accelerated bachelor's degree program at SAU as listed above toward completion and successful graduation.

ARTICLE IV AGREEMENT ON COMMUNICATION

OCC and SAU agree to cooperate in communicating with each other and with their common and respective audiences concerning the established relationship between the two institutions. OCC and SAU further agree to communicate concerning curriculum changes which affect the agreed upon relationship between articulated programs at the respective college, and to communicate concerning the development of plans which might lead to future opportunities between the two institutions.

- 1. Any marketing of the Agreement in print will be subject to the prior approval of both parties. Each institution will assume responsibility for appropriate marketing to reach their respective student and faculty populations.
- 2. Faculty and staff at both institutions will communicate information about this Agreement to students and prospective students.
- 3. Each party may provide on its website a link to the partner institution's website at each institution's discretion.

ARTICLE V

AGREEMENT ON MAINTENANCE AND REVIEW

ARTICLE VI TERMS OF AGREEMENT

- A. Length of Agreement and Renewal This Agreement will become effective upon the execution of signatures by the responsible authority for each institution and will remain in effect until three years from the execution of signatures has expired. At that time, the agreement must be renewed with new signatures and dates.
- B. Non-renewal If the Agreement is not renewed, students who have selected and designated this program prior to termination of the Agreement will be given one (1) additional year to enroll in courses. However, the student must be admitted to SAU before the termination of the agreement. Either OCC or SAU may terminate this Agreement at any time for any reason. Both OCC and SAU agree to provide written notice of at least 90 days in advance of termination.
- C. Review and Modification of the Agreement Each institution will notify the other of any contemplated curricular changes that would affect the future of this Agreement.
- D. Indemnification To the extent permitted by law, OCC and SAU agree to indemnify and hold one another harmless from any and all claims initiated by student participants, their parents, survivors, or agents, arising from any negligent acts or omission on the part of either institution or any of their employees.
